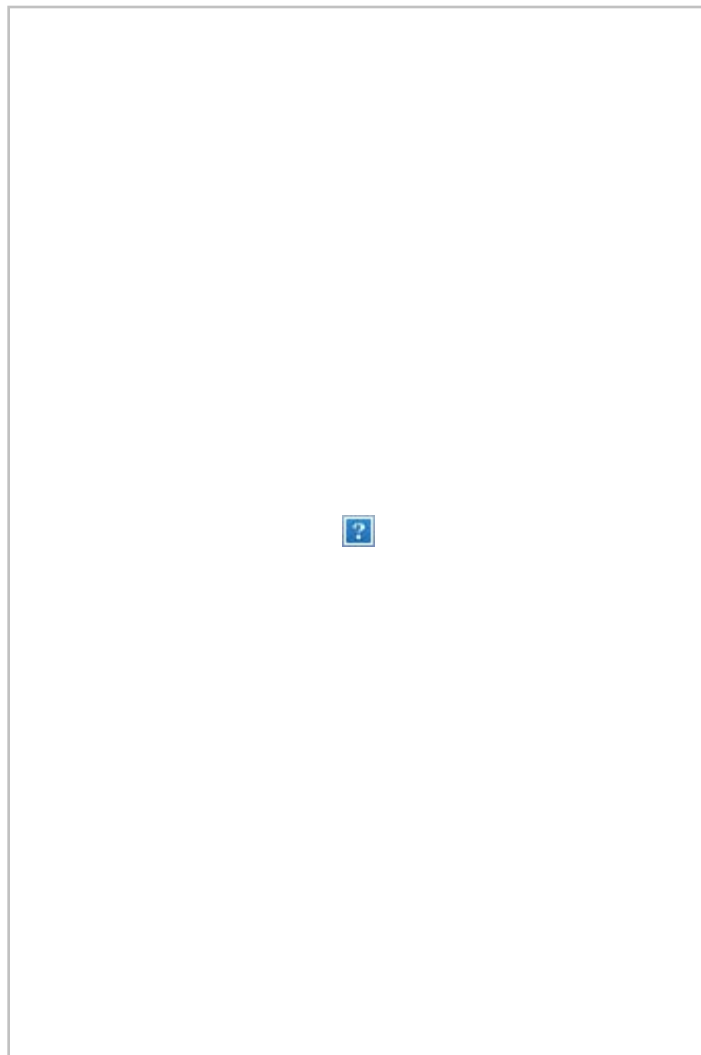

Preferred - Completion of UWHC Basic Arrhythmia competency. ACLS and PALS certification. NVCI (Non-violent Crisis Intervention training).

Knowledge of Standard Precaution techniques and ability to incorporate Standard Precaution techniques while providing patient care

- Knowledge of safety measures used during provision of patient care
- Knowledge and ability to practice aseptic technique
- Ability to read in order to interpret type and level of patient care ordered, to record patient vital signs, and to understand and follow instruction related to basic patient care
- Ability to learn patient care procedures.
- Ability to apply patient safety protocols.
- Ability to understand the use of patient care equipment and supplies and the principles of infections control.
- Ability to work under a fast paced and stressful environment.
- Ability to observe and accurately report on the condition of the patient.
- Ability to communicate directly with physicians, nursing staff, patients, and patient families to receive instructions on the treatment plan and report changes in the patient's condition

Physical Requirements:

Medium: Ability to lift up to 50 pounds maximum with frequent lifting and/or carrying objects weighing up to 25 pounds.

Work Schedule: 60% FTE, 24 hours. Night, 8/12 hour shifts between the hours of 1900-0730, with every other weekend rotation. Hours may vary based on the operational needs of the department.
